Provides special immigrant petitions for children in foster care, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), Replacement green card or I-94, temporary protected status (TPS), refugee green card and refugee family petition, extension of work authorizations, affidavits of support, USCIS fee waiver request, Notary Public services, document translation, religious visas, re-entry visas, photographs, FBI fingerprint check, and immigration legal consultations.

- **Health Legal Services** provides free legal assistance to eligible clients living with HIV/AIDS or diabetes in the following areas: Public and Private Benefits and Insurance, Housing Rights, Discrimination against individuals based on their HIV/AIDS or diabetes status or other protected classes, Employment Rights, Estate Planning and Wills, Debtor Relief and other services.
- **Mental Health Advocacy Project** provides assistance with public benefits such as SSI, Medi-Cal, Medicare, CaWORKS, General Assistance, and other general legal issues. Staff addresses issues of housing and homelessness by defending evictions and assisting with housing complaints including discrimination, abuse and neglect, landlord/tenant conflicts and habitability.
- **Legal Advocates for Children & Youth (LACY)** provides legal and social work services to children and youth up to age 21 who are, are suspected of being, or are at high risk of being commercially sexually exploited.
